**Part – A : Plan of Action:**

Education is a vital necessity in our present day world, with great overtones both nationally and internationally. Education helps to establish order around oneself and keeps abreast of the technological changes taking place around the world. This has been the guiding principle of our actions in imparting knowledge to our students. We have been successful since the inception of our college in making many a students doctors, chartered accountants, scientists, class-I officers etc. Keeping our vision, objectives and goals in view we have scrupulously worked out our strategic plan for 2009-10 to achieve the targeted results.

Our college has a vision of improving creativity skills of youth and thus committed to provide all necessary facilities to the teachers to offer practical orientation in order to impart latest knowledge to the students. In this direction, we have formulated an action plan for 2009-10 in respect of various activities to be under taken.

**1. Seminars and Symposia:**

We are planning to send proposals to State Council of Higher Education, Hyderabad and UGC for approval to conduct two National Level Seminars during the Academic Year 2009-10.

**2. Extension Lectures:**

To organize at least 5 to 6 Extension Lectures in each department by inviting eminent personalities in the respective fields/subjects.

**3. Study Tours / Industrial Tours / Field Trips:**

With regard to Arts and Commerce at least two study/industrial tours in respect of each faculty are conducted to bring awareness about the latest developments in the respective fields of activity. With regard to Science students botanical tours are conducted to enable the students to collect and view different types of plants and species.

**4. English Language Skills:**

Spoken English classes are to be conducted for Degree and PG students to improve their communicative and language skills. The present lab meant for improving skills of communication in English will be further strengthened in terms availability of software and enrich the knowledge of students.

**5. Computer Skills:**

It is proposed to give training to B.Com students in Computerized Accounting Packages through special classes to be conducted during the winter and summer vacation to make them employable. Apart from that the latest updation of computers with nodes will be used to improve the software skills of MCA and MBA students. A proposal is also prepared to go for additional number of PCs to cater to the needs of increasing strength of degree sections to provide the systems in 1:2 ratio to help them to practice.

**6. Remedial Classes:**

We are expecting that the UGC would sanction an amount of Rs. 50,00,000 for the developmental activities of the college out of which a part of the amount will be allocated towards remedial classes to pay honorarium to the teachers who actively associate themselves with taking remedial classes for average and below average students to bring them up on par with intelligent students.

**7. Awareness Programmes:**

We are planning to visit villages along with NSS volunteers and NCC cadets to bring awareness among the rural mass about the dreadful diseases like AIDS, DENGUE, CHICKEN GUNYA, HEPETITIS-B etc and educate them regarding the precautions required to be taken to avoid such diseases. We hold at least two health camps in the villages during the academic year 2009-10 involving senior doctors to be sponsored by MGM Hospital and Regional Eye Hospital of Warangal for eye check-up and polio vaccination.

**8. Inter-Collegiate Activities:**

An inter-collegiate sports meet will be conducted involving all the local colleges to promote sense of belongingness among the teachers and students of different colleges. The responsibility of conducting this event will be carried out by our Physical Director. We are also proposing to hold inter-collegiate cultural competitions in our college involving the students of local colleges. The expenditure involved in these two meets will be met by our management.

**9. Campus Placements:**

We have formed a placement cell which will look after the placement of students by inviting the representatives of several companies to conduct interviews in the campus. Our placement cell has been established to link with many companies like INFOSIS, ICA (Institute of Computer Accountants), Reddy Labs etc.

**10. Teachers Training & Evaluation:**

Teachers shall be deputed to Refresher/Orientation programmes conducted by various universities and institutions. This will help in improving the academic talents of the teachers. Regarding evaluation of teachers' performance we are proposing to install complaint boxes in front of each department to take the feedback of the students and planning to initiate action against erring teachers to realize and correct themselves. Apart from complaint boxes we are also planning to administer a pre-structured questionnaire to take the views of the students to evaluate teaching abilities of the faculty.

**11. Alumni Activities:**

We are planning to hold at least two alumni meetings in every year to generate funds to extend financial assistance to poor students of different faculties to enable them to pursue their education further. The Alumni will also be involved in conducting inter-collegiate cultural and literate competitions to inculcate the competitive spirit among the students.

**12. Construction Activities to enhance further the Infrastructure Facilities:**

Steps shall be taken to further strengthen the infrastructure facilities in the form of library, computer labs etc. It is also proposed to make an appeal to the UGC to release the remaining amount of Rs. 50,00,000 out of One Crore rupees sanctioned to complete the construction of girls hostel .

**13. Cultural Club:**

The 'efforts are on' since last academic year (2008-09) to realize the long felt desire of creating a cultural club by inviting talented people like Sri. Nerella Venu Madhav, an international expert in mimicry, to promote cultural talents of the students of not only our college but also the talented youth living in and around the district head quarters of Warangal.

**Part – B :****1. Activities undertaken**

In order to achieve the objectives earmarked in the Annual Action Plan, the following activities are undertaken during the academic year 2009-2010.

- i. Proposals for two seminars were sent to State Council of Education, Andhra Pradesh and UGC but no specific response has come from the respective authorities in the Academic Year 2009-10.
- ii. Organized 25 Extension Lectures in different departments involving the experts from various universities. We have also invited Industrialists and Chartered Accountants to impart practical knowledge to the students..
- iii. Intra and inter-class co-curricular activities are conducted. Our NCC cadets and NSS volunteers participated in National level competitions.
- iv. Several field studies are conducted involving the students to enhance their practical knowledge.
- v. Additional facilities are created with regard to accommodation, sports, computers, labs, furniture, books and journals etc.
- vi. Proposal for B.Com Computers for Telugu Medium Section was sent to Academic Council of Kakatiya University for its approval to introduce the course from the Academic Year 2010-11 with an intake of 50 students. The Screening Committee sent by State Council of Higher Education, Hyderabad, has verified the availability of infrastructure to start this course and recommended positively. Probably the course may be started from next academic year on receiving the approval letter from the Commission.
- vii. 20 research articles are presented in National and International Journals by Degree and PG staff members.

- viii. Campus placement programmes have been conducted involving the executives of various corporate sectors and helped the students to get employed with handfull packages.
- ix. Regular interactive sessions have been organized with students, parents and alumni to improve further the academic standards of the institution.
- x. Cultural activities, games, NSS special camps, NCC activities were carried out to bring awareness among the students with regard to rich traditions and culture adopted in rural areas. We have conducted dramas and stage appearances involving the students to make the people aware of the fruits associated with national integration.

## **2. New Academic programmes initiated at UG and PG levels:**

At UG level we are planning to introduce computer subject in all faculties to make the students learn fundamentals of computers. We have sent proposals to State Council of Higher Education to introduce B.Com – Computers for Telugu Medium students in order to cater to the needs of students representing the rural areas. The expert committee visited the college and expressed their willingness to permit this course from the next academic year i.e., 2010-2011.

## **3. Innovation in curricular design and transaction:**

Our staff belonging to different faculties are working as members of Board of Studies of different departments of Kakatiya University, Warangal, and playing an active role in framing syllabus according to the fast changing technologies and practices. They are very particular to avoid duplication and repetition of the syllabus covered at lower levels of education in preparing syllabi for higher levels to strengthen the contents of the subjects to improve the knowledge of the students.

## **4. Inter - disciplinary programmes:**

During this academic year 2009-10 inter disciplinary programmes have been organized to improve the knowledge, analytical ability and cognitive skills of the students. The various programmes undertaken by the college are:

- Dr. M. Mahender Reddy, Head, Department of Botany, has given a lecture to the students of all faculties on 12-11-2009 explaining the fast deteriorating environment and importance of greenery. He stressed that each student as a

responsible citizen of the country should plant at least one sprout and should manage and protect it by giving necessary inputs to it to see that it develops into a Huge Tree.

- Dr. Md. Saleem Akthar, Reader in Commerce, has taken an orientation class to non-commerce students highlighting the importance of learning basic accounting principles to account for their personal economic data to plan for future revenues and expenditure. He also expressed that the knowledge of basic concepts of accounting helps them to exercise control over their expenditure and also for optimal use of their scarce resources.
- Dr. B. Nagaiah, Reader in Physics, addressed the students of all faculties on 1-11-2009 and stressed the National Integration is the need of the hour. He further said that India possess abundant resources to exploit for the development of the country and there is no need for youth to look at foreign countries to get absorbed. He opined the brain-drain helps only foreign countries to develop at the cost of our country.

## **5. Examination Reforms Implemented:**

The college has continued the practice of conducting Quarterly, Half yearly and Pre-final examinations apart from slip tests. The valued answer scripts were distributed to the students within a week's time and the doubts were clarified. The lists of the candidates who did not take up examinations were displayed on the notice board and letters were also sent to the parents informing the performance of the students in the examinations. Question Banks were supplied to the students before the pre-final examinations to make them perfect for university examination. The Question Banks for practical examinations prescribed by K.U. have been taken up by all the departments and the students are well trained for the end examinations.

**6. Candidates qualified in NET/SLET/M.Phil/Ph.D:**

Mr. P. Mallikarjun, a staff member of our PG section has been awarded with M.Phil degree by Periyar University, Chennai, in the year 2009.

Mrs. Aruna D. H. Rao, lecturer in Zoology, is on the verge of completion of her Ph.D in a few months to come. Presently she is on Faculty Improvement Programme (FIP).

**7. Initiative towards Faculty Development Programme:**

Our efforts are proved to be fruitful in making faculty of different disciplines to improve their knowledge and keep them abreast with latest developments in their respective subjects. We have invited experts from different fields like academics, industrialists, professionals etc., and conducted one to two-day symposiums in each month through out the academic year 2009-10. This facility has been availed by some of the faculty members working with other colleges.

**8. Seminars, Workshops, Conferences / Extension lectures organized:****I. Seminars/Workshops, Conferences organized:**

The Department of Commerce organized a workshop in the month of December, 2009, in which only final year students of B.Com are involved. The theme of the workshop was “How to make the Power Looms viable in the present day competition from Corporate Textile Sector”. They identified the problems confronted by the weavers in terms of finance, marketing and overall management of the loom and offered suggestions to overcome a few of them.

The Department of Mathematics organized a Workshop on 19<sup>th</sup> February, 2010 with the title Simpsons’ 1/3 rule & Trape Zoidal Rule. The students were given a chance to present themselves to enable them to have practical exposure.

**23. Assessment of Teachers and action taken on the students Feedback**

In our U.G. and P.G. Center, we have introduced evaluation of the performance of teachers by students since the inception of the college. According to this, a structured questionnaire covering various aspects of academic and extra-curricular activities is administered to the students and the students rate the performance of the teachers on a five-point scale. The fee-back given by the students is analysed and the teachers whose performance is not satisfactory are counseled, warned and punished as per the requirement. This method of evaluation is helping the teachers to improve their performance.

The unit cost of education for UG section is Rs. 1, 450 and for PG section Rs. 8,870 as mentioned in earlier reports mainly due to similar fee-structure adopted since a decade.

The administration is fully computerized. Every section is provided with a system and all the systems are connected through LAN. A package is designed for Office Automation to carryout work pertaining to admission process, accounts, salary bills, and examination results. A HP laser colour 1515 N printer also was purchased for Rs. 28,900 for administrative convenience to generate qualitative reports and make the correspondence more effective..

**B). Process of Admission:**

The admission process of intake of students into various degree courses is fully computerized and the rules and regulations prescribed by the Commissioner of Collegiate Education, Government of Andhra Pradesh, are scrupulously followed in maintaining the roaster system. This process includes preparation of 3 lists viz., 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup>, based on merit of the students, with a specific time gap of 3 to 5 days to give option for students to join the selected courses as per the schedule prescribed by the Kakatiya University. The left over unfilled seats, if any, will be filled up through spot selection based on merit from the students present on the day as declared in advance.

For all PG courses the admission is undertaken by the Directorate of Admissions, Kakatiya University, Warangal. The management quota seats are filled up by the management as per the guidelines of AICTE, APSCHE and KU, Warangal.

Apart from that every department is provided with computers with internet facility to keep abreast with latest technological changes taking place world over in order to update further.

#### **28. Computer and Internet Access:**

All the departments of the college are connected with internet facility. The software programmes were also updated from time to time. Computer awareness programme is take-up for the new staff members. The purchase of 60 Nodes at a cost of Rs. 15,20,000 by our PG section stands as an example for the steps taken to improve computer and internet access. The total number of computers available at UG Lab is 70, MBA Lab 122, MCA Lab 90. During this academic year a Benq DLP projector was purchased and installed for Rs. 30,000 to meet the requirements of students in UG section.

**B). From Alumni:**

Our College Alumni of Commerce Department has been very liberal in providing financial assistance to the meritorious and poor students to help them to pursue further the higher education. For the academic year 2009-10 they have sponsored two gold medals and financial assistance to the extent of Rs. 20,000 to 20 students (poorest of the poor) @ Rs. 1000 each. They have also come forward to pay the fees amount of few poor students when they were not in a position to continue their education. This amount approximately works out to Rs. 30, 000. Sri. P. Murali Mohan, a former student of Poultry Science Department managing a poultry farm at Khammam has donated Rs. 25,000/- to develop the Department further to increase the intake of students.

**C). From Management:**

Our management is very liberal in providing funds for the development of the college. During the academic year 2009-10, an amount of Rs.12,00,000 was sanctioned to take up developmental activities like purchase of furniture, construction of class rooms and parking sheds, greenery of campus, etc. With regard to PG section, they have contributed an amount of Rs. 3,05,000/- to enrich the library with standard books. **30. Activities and Support from the Alumni Associations:**

The activities undertaken by Alumni of the college are commendable for their philanthropic endeavors as mentioned below.

**I. The activities undertaken by the Commerce Alumni Society:**

1. The Commerce Alumni Society is a registered society and has given Rs. 30000/- @ Rs. 1000/- each to the poor students of B.Com section of our college in the academic year 2009-10.
2. The society is sponsoring two gold medals every year to be presented to the over all topper in girls' category and the topper in Income Tax subject in B. Com. Final year to motivate the students to work hard.
3. They provide active support to the Department of Commerce to organize the inter-collegiate commerce meet to conduct a number of activities like quiz, essay writing, pick-n-speak, elocution etc., to select 'Mr/Miss Commerce'. The cost of prizes and conduct of the meet will be met by the Alumni Association amounting to Rs.30, 000 to Rs.40, 000.

## **II. The Poultry Science Alumni Society activities:**

The alumni society of Poultry Science has been very liberal in providing donations to the poultry department to build up the Department to serve many of the students willing to pursue this course. One of the former students of this Department has donated Rs. 25, 000 to increase the capacity of the poultry farm to rear at least 1000 birds in each batch. The alumni meets will be conducted every year in the Poultry Department and enquires about its progress to keep the department alive to serve the society in a better way.

### **31. Activities and support from the Parent-Teacher Association:**

We have the practice of conducting at least one parents' meet every year. This academic year i.e., 2009-10, the meeting was held on 12<sup>th</sup> December, 2009. After a thread bare discussion the following decisions are taken.

- To identify the poor students and conduct remedial classes at the end of academic year.
- To inculcate work culture among the students by involving them at least once in a fortnight in cleaning and greening the college and other social institutions rendering free services to the society.
- To ensure full attendance of the students and if they fail to report continuously for a week the same information to be corresponded to the concerned parents to take corrective action.
- To provide hostel facilities.
- To provide campus placements.
- To inform the progress of the students periodically.

### **32. Health Services:**

'Health is wealth' slogan is practically followed and practiced by our staff members through the organization of various camps both inside and outside the college campus. Many a blood donation camps were conducted under NSS and NCC banners in the campus. In each camp nearly 70 to 100 volunteers/students have donated blood. ### **39. Healthy Practices of the Institution:**

Our college is adopting the healthy practices as recommended by members of IQAC during 2009-10. These practices include:

1. College has organized a number of study tours like Industrial tours, The Department of History conducted an Education Tour to Ramappa and Laknavaram on 4-11-2009 with 30 students of B.A final year to bring awareness with regard to the rich culture adopted during the Kakatiyans dynasty. This tour was led by Sri. A. Raghuvender Reddy, faculty member of History. Dr. P. Anjaiah, senior faculty member of this department, has taken initiative to make the students to write a report on Warangal Fort with regard to social, administrative and cultural values adopted during those days.
2. Botanical tour has been conducted by the Botany Department involving B.Sc II year students and taken them to nearby Pakal lake of Warangal District to collect herbarium.
3. Department of English has put lot efforts to improve the soft-skills of the students by using the well established language laboratory.
4. Organising friendly cricket matches between staff and students and staff of UG with that of PG to maintain cordial relations between the staff and students. Once in two years we have the practice of conducting various sports activities between the staff members of different colleges.
5. Extending co-operation and guidance to other colleges with regard to procedure to be adopted to approach NAAC for accreditation. Mock Parliament and Mock Stock-Exchange programmes are conducted involving the students of other colleges. Mock Interviews are Conducted to train the students to improve their communicative and interactive skills.
6. The Poultry Department has been rendering yeomen services in terms of giving technical guidance to the poultry farmers as and when they approach the Department of Poultry Science. The Head of the Department Dr. E. Gopal Reddy along with students carried out postmortem in times of death of birds due to infection and suggested the farmers the precautions required to be taken and prescribed medicines to be used to avoid such

damage. Some times free medicines are provided to farmers to protect the birds from such menace.

#### **40. Linkages:**

The college has good reputation and maintains regular contacts with other institutions and academic bodies to undertake activities that are beneficial to the students. Frequently we organize workshops and symposiums inviting experts from various fields like judiciary, medicine, law and order, agriculture, corporate sector/industry, consumer societies, women associations etc. Our college has two distant education centers viz., IGNOU and SDLCE. In each of these centers nearly 400 students are taking counseling in different courses. Majority of the counselors selected are from our college belonging to different faculties. We have got connection with majority of recruitment and academic bodies like APPSC, EAMCET, EDSET, CAIIB, APSRTC etc and conduct the respective competitive examinations as per the specified schedule involving our staff members. The staff has linkages with the publishers of text books to get their books printed and published. The staff also maintains regular contact with the publishers of Journals and Magazines to publish their research articles. The Poultry Science Department of our college has established linkages with poultry farms in and around Warangal that help the students to undergo practical training at least for 10 days every year to understand the modalities involved in managing the poultry farms efficiently.

### **Part: C**

#### **Details of the plans of the institution for the year 2010-2011:**

Our college has a vision of improving creativity skills of youth and thus committed to provide all necessary facilities to the teachers to offer practical orientation in order to impart latest knowledge to the students. In this direction, we have formulated an action plan for 2010-11 in respect of various activities to be under taken.

**1. Seminars and Symposiums:**

The staff council meeting held on 12-06-2010 unanimously decided to conduct at least one seminar by each department on contemporary topics during the academic year 2010-11. A Screening Committee has been formed to scrutinize the proposals to check their viability before they are being forwarded to sponsoring agencies like UGC, State Council of Higher Education etc.

**2. Extension Lectures:**

Each department is authorized to conduct at least 10 to 15 extension lectures involving the experts from various fields and necessary funds have been allotted department-wise to meet the expenditure associated with such lectures.

**3. Study Tours / Industrial Tours / Field Trips:**

Conduct of study tours has been made compulsory for each faculty involving final year students to provide practical exposure.

**4. English Language Skills:**

The Department of English has been fixed with targets to take initiative to strengthen at least 10 batches of students consisting of 30 students in each batch belonging to Commerce, Arts and Science faculties to improve the soft skills and make them perfect. One more Computer Programmer will be appointed to guide the students in this regard.

**5. Computer Skills:**

An initiative is taken to strengthen the Computers Department by appointing 2 faculty members and 3 programmers. It is also approved to add 20 more systems with latest technology and high capacity to cater to the needs of the students to practice and gain practical knowledge.

**6. Remedial Classes:**

We are expecting that the UGC would sanction an amount of Rs. 50,00,000 for the developmental activities of the college out of which a part of the amount will be allocated towards remedial classes to pay honorarium to the teachers who actively associate themselves with taking remedial classes for average and below average students to bring them up on par with intelligent students.

**7. Awareness Programmes:**

We are planning to visit villages along with NSS volunteers and NCC cadets to bring awareness among the rural mass about the dreadful diseases like AIDS, DENGUE, CHICKEN GUNYA, HEPETITIS-B etc and educate them regarding the precautions required to be taken to avoid such diseases. We hold at least two health camps in the villages during the academic year 2010-11 involving senior doctors to be sponsored by MGM Hospital and Regional Eye Hospital for eye check-up and polio vaccination.

**8. Inter-Collegiate Activities:**

An inter-collegiate sports meet will be conducted involving all the local colleges to promote sense of belongingness among the teachers and students of different colleges. The responsibility of conducting this event will be carried out by our Physical Director. We are also proposing to hold inter-collegiate cultural competitions in our college involving the students of local colleges. The expenditure involved in these two meets will be met by our management.

**9. Campus Placements:**

We have formed a placement cell which will look after the placement of students by inviting the representatives of several companies to conduct interviews in the campus. Our placement cell has established link with many companies like INFOSIS, ICA( Institute of Computer Accountants), Reddy Labs etc.

**10. Teachers Training & Evaluation:**

Teachers shall be deputed to Refresher/Orientation programmes conducted by various universities and institutions. This will help in improving the academic standards of the teachers. Regarding evaluation of teachers' performance we are proposing to install complaint boxes in front of each department to take the feedback of the students and planning to initiate action against erring teachers to get themselves correct. Apart from complaint boxes we are also planning to administer a pre-structured questionnaire to take the views of the students to evaluate teaching abilities of the faculty.

**11. Alumni Activities:**

We are planning to hold at least two alumni meetings in every year to generate funds to extend financial assistance to poor students of different faculties to enable them to pursue their

education further. The Alumni will also be involved in conducting inter-collegiate cultural and literate competitions to improve the competitive spirit among the students.

#### **12. Construction Activities to enhance further the Infrastructure Facilities:**

Steps shall be taken to further strengthen the infrastructure facilities in the form of library, computer labs etc. It is also proposed to make an appeal to the UGC to release the remaining amount of Rs. 50,00,000 out of one Crore rupees sanctioned to complete the construction of girls hostel .

#### **13. Cultural Club:**

The 'efforts are on' to realize the long felt desire of creating a cultural club by inviting talented people like Sri. Nerella Venu Madhav, an international expert in mimicry, to promote cultural talents of the students of not only our college but also the talented youth living in and around the district head quarters of Warangal. Still this process is going on to give it a practical shape.
